### 9 MEDITATING FOR INSIGHT

**Garrie O'Toole**

Contrary to some popular misunderstandings, Buddhist meditation is not particularly concerned with creating a safe place to which we can escape from the difficult realities of our lives. Nor is it necessarily about discovering special spiritual states that are in some way more "real" than our everyday reality. In meditation we are encouraged to develop the courage to become familiar with our own mind and to recognise the ways in which we are repeatedly caught up in habitual patterns of behaviour and emotion that are often not helpful to ourselves and others. And as we become more familiar with our mind through meditation, we begin to discover qualities of clarity, tranquillity and compassion that have been available to us all along, but which we have so far failed to acknowledge.

This course will introduce several meditation techniques from within the Buddhist tradition, explore the importance of physical posture, common difficulties that can arise in meditation as well as an overview of the some of the stages of meditation practice.

Garrie O'Toole has been involved in Buddhist practice and study since 1978. He has been a student of the Venerable Traleg Kyabgon Rinpoche for almost two decades and is a meditation instructor at E-Vam Institute. He has also completed a Master of Arts degree in Buddhist Studies.

### 10 AN INTRODUCTION TO HUAYEN BUDDHISM

**Tony Prince**

The Huayen school of Chinese Buddhism was founded as a separate lineage in the seventh century and has continued down to the present day. It has had a strong influence on the Chan (Zen) School in particular, and is currently undergoing a revival in Taiwan.

This course will introduce the Avatamsaka (Huayen) Sutra itself and the basic teachings of the Huayen School concerning Enlightenment, the nature of reality and the practice of the Bodhisattva Path.

Tony Prince taught Chinese Studies at the University of Sydney from 1977 till his retirement in 2000, and has published several articles on Huayen Buddhism. Before his appointment he lived in Taiwan and Japan for five years, and he has made several return visits to Taiwan since then. He is also a practitioner of Tibetan Buddhism and Dzogchen.

### 11 PRACTICE OF MINDFULNESS MEDITATION

**Venerable Sayadaw U. Pandita**

This course will investigate how the practice of mindfulness can dispel anxiety, depression, irritability etc., and replace these with a peaceful mind. Practice sessions of meditation will be integrated with theory.

Venerable Sayadaw U. Pandita received novice ordination in 1979 and higher ordination in 1984 in Myanmar, at Mahasi Centre, Yangon, from the revered Sayadaw U. Pandita of Panditarama Monastery Meditation Centre. He has done extensive meditation retreat and holds a B.A. in Buddhist literature (Yangon). He has taught in the U.S., Malaysia and Singapore, Indonesia and Thailand, and currently teaches in Australia at the Malaysian Buddhist Meditation Centre.
